
- elimination of problematic sectors for navigation on the Danube, modernisation of rail infrastructure, road and inland waterways safety projects, intermodal terminal, ITS
- renewable energy sources, energy market integration, decarbonisation and clean energy, just transition, digitalisation and smart grids, and energy security, energy efficiency, capacity building of the energy agency to align with the package clean energy for all Europeans

#### Regional approach to planning priorities

The Green Agenda will be an opportunity to revisit the overall transport strategies and to promote a greener and more sustainable transport network. Serbia is committed to the following **initiatives**:

supporting the implementation of the regional action plan for rail reforms,
transport modes,
ensuring implementation of EU technical standards in all transport modes, in particular the European Railway Traffic
Management System,
supporting the implementation of the regional action plan for transport facilitation, including border-crossing points, aiming at
resource-efficient transport operations,
supporting the implementation of the road safety action plan and the road action plan, including ITS, road maintenance and
resilience,
supporting the implementation of regional waterborne and multimodal action plan,
planning and implementing sustainable mobility solutions, including alternative fuels infrastructure, charging stations.

### **Danube Strategy - niche**

- Functional area
- \* EU and non-EU countries equal footing— cohesion and enlargement policies
- Multi-level governance
- Develop key solutions, new methodologies, practices or networks for new forms of cooperation

#### **Challenges, Next steps and Conclusions**

- References in strategic documents basis for embedding Actions at national level contribute to the Danube Strategy priorities
- Cooperation welcome. How to implement? Aspects of coordination and financing of transnational activities
- ❖ Challenges: How to include cooperation elements in the national level actions with no flexibility for funding outside the territory (like in EU MS)? Scope for joint calls limited. Some grant schemes exist − Science fund, Innovation fund, development of tourism offer (extra points)
- EUD Serbia <MRS need to identify concrete actions with clear deliverables and sensitize all stakeholders around them. Vague initiatives such as increase cooperation in area are not sufficient>

#### **Challenges, Next steps and Conclusions**

#### Next steps:

- Work closely with the Commission and Delegations DG REGIO role in promoting cooperation, DG NEAR strategic role in programming IPA
- Meetings of Steering group members (with Priority Area Coordinators) and national programming authorities/line ministries and the EU delegation to discuss further what can be envisaged as joint actions for financing
- Managing and programming authorities network to create ownership and understanding of the macro-regional added value
- Map out actions in countries and look for synergies. Design concrete measures for knowledge exchange and joint approaches

#### **Challenges, Next steps and Conclusions**

- Transnational programmes cooperation for policy improvements, Synergy of national programmes with capitalization process
- CBC programmes— good practice Hungary-Serbia EUSDR ad-hoc observer in Monitoring Committee
- Increase coordination with regional initiatives

Cooperation is crucial- synergies, capitalisation and coordination to Increase impact of interventions
