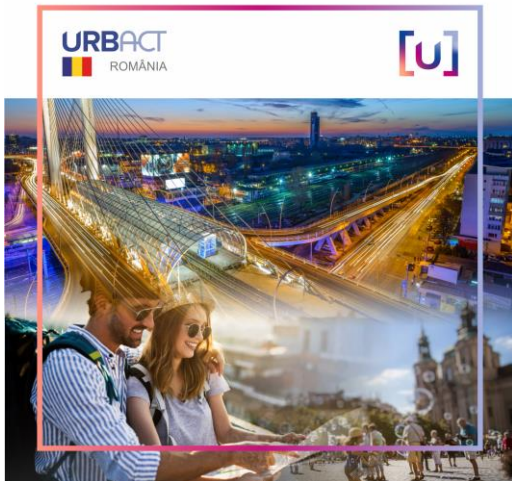

# Results of the URBACT III networks

**Network:** INTERACTIVE CITIES

**Lead Partner:** Genova (Italy)

**Challenge :** Enabling citizens participation in promoting the city to tourists, workers and business



## Network outputs:

- Implementation of pilot digital services to visitors
- Creation of a territorial marketing strategy with relevant stakeholders of the city
- Creation of a bilateral exchange with Murcia (Spain) to get inspired on their digital co-creative process for neighbourhood regeneration
- Joint strategy between the city and the Chamber of Commerce labelled “**URBACT Good Practice**”

# Main beneficiaries of URBACT IV

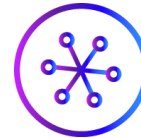
