Winegrowing and winemaking traditions of the Carpathians date back nearly one thousand years, making up an essential part of the local cultural heritage. Nevertheless, they are still not well-known to the general public. The Wine Academy project team wants to reveal the secrets of Carpathian wines by both preserving and promoting local wine traditions. The project focuses on two main wine regions: Zakarpattya (UA) and Podkarpacie (PL). Within the first part of the project – implemented within the Poland – Belarus – Ukraine ENI CBC programme – a thorough research was done to explore the different authentic grape varieties, types of wines and winemaking traditions. The research led to the production of different deliverables, among which the « Carpathian wine list » and the « Wine route map » both available on the Wine Academy project and the ENI CBC PBU Programme websites. In addition, two additional important activities fall within the scope of the project: a wine festival, which was held in Vynohradiv (UA), and an educational event organised in Podkarpacie Voivodeship (PL).

ENI-CROSS BORDER COOPERATION

The Hutsuls represent an ethnic group living mainly in the cross-border area of Bistra (RO)- Rakhiv (UA), two regions from different countries which share a common culture. To preserve and promote the Hutsul historical heritage, the partners of the project "Pro Hutsul" cooperate with a series of initiatives. The first is the rehabilitation of the Memorial House "Havrelo Klempus" from Bistra (RO) and the "Burkut Amphitheater" from Rakhiv, two important sites representative to the culture of this ethnic minority. Then 80 Members of the Hutsul ensembles of both areas will exchange cultural events aimed at raising awareness of their presence in the Romania-Ukraine cross-border region and at promoting project activities. The initiative is implemented within the Romania-Ukraine ENI CBC programme.

ENI-CROSS BORDER COOPERATION

The aim of this project is to improve the access to the labour market of young people with disabilities from the Romanian (Iasi) and Moldovan territories. In particular, the initiative focuses on improving career guidance services, and tailoring them to people with special needs. The project partners have developed training curricula, handbooks and quality standards for this purpose, they have trained 3,600 professionals from education and employment systems in both countries and they have informed more than 1,500 students and youngsters with disabilities on the inclusive career guidance services available for them. In addition, information workshops have been organised for the parents to understand their role and support their children in becoming more independent. Thanks to the project activities, career guidance services for people with disabilities have been regulated within the Employment Agency of the Republic of Moldova and recommendations for improving the policies and practices of these services have been provided to decision-makers and other relevant stakeholders.
