

## ENHANCING REGIONAL COOPERATION IN THE DANUBE BASIN: STRONGER TOGETHER

### *EUSDR specific event on water, emergency response and disaster risk management*

#### **Background**

In recent years, the Danube Region has witnessed a series of unforeseen catastrophic events caused by severe floods, storms and fires. Therefore, effective, cooperative and fast emergency planning and response is vital. A lack of coordination and response to disasters can have serious and long-lasting impacts on a community and can also lead to more death tolls. Disaster management can help to enhance the ability of emergency responders to save lives. Appropriate infrastructure and training guarantee for the local communities to better deal with disasters in the future.

This event is strategically aligned with the core principles of EU macro-regional strategies (MRS), which emphasise the importance of cooperation, coordination, multi-level governance, and partnership across sectors and national borders.

The primary objectives of this event, taking place under the auspices of the Bosnian and Herzegovinian EUSDR Presidency, are to advance the dissemination of EUSDR Priority Area-5 (Environmental risks) and Priority Area 10 (Institutional capacity and cooperation) activities, particularly in the domains of water management, emergency response and disaster management, and to foster stronger engagement and involvement of EU candidate countries within the Danube region. By enhancing communication, consultation, and coordination mechanisms, the meeting seeks to strengthen existing cooperation frameworks and establish new networks that address shared challenges, thus contributing to the overall resilience and sustainability of the Danube Region.

#### **Objectives and main goals:**

##### **Strengthening Regional Cooperation**

- Foster cross-border collaboration in environmental risk management, disaster response, and institutional capacity building.
- Enhance the involvement of EU candidate countries in EUSDR PA 5 and PA 10 activities, with the active participation of the Bosnian and Herzegovinian EUSDR Presidency (BA PRESIDENCY).

##### **Showcasing EUSDR PA 5 and EUSDR PA 10 Achievements**

- Present key PA 5 project results in flood risk management, disaster resilience, and climate adaptation.
- Highlight PA10 initiatives on governance, institutional cooperation, and civil protection coordination.
- Share best practices and innovative approaches to preparedness and response.

##### **Integrating EU Candidate Countries**

- Address challenges in water management, disaster preparedness, and emergency response.
- Align regional strategies with European policies to support the EU enlargement process.

##### **Water, Disaster Risk, and Institutional Capacity Building**

- Promote transboundary cooperation in drought, flood risk, and crisis response.
- Advance nature-based solutions, innovative prevention methods, and civil protection frameworks.

## **Improving Coordination and Communication**

- Strengthen engagement with national agencies, Steering Group members, and international partners.
- Explore funding opportunities and project collaborations supporting PA 5 and PA 10 objectives.

### **Key Activities:**

**Knowledge Cafés Forum:** Interactive sessions to engage stakeholders in identifying gaps, challenges, and best practices in environmental risk and disaster management. Given the distinct approaches of water management (prevention-oriented) and disaster risk management (crisis-oriented), discussions may run in parallel to ensure focused contributions.

### **Expected Outcomes:**

- Strengthened cooperation mechanisms and regional networks
- Enhanced integration of EU candidate countries into EUSDR PA 5 and EUSDR PA 10 initiatives, fostering cross-border partnerships
- A concrete action plan to improve the participation of EU candidate countries in macro-regional strategies
- Identification of key priorities and a tentative project list for future collaboration

This consultation meeting represents a significant opportunity to solidify cooperation, share knowledge, and coordinate actions across the Danube region, ensuring a more resilient and integrated approach to manage environmental risks including disaster management.
